Overnight Retreat (any day Monday - Sunday; weekend 2 day minimum)

Come and spend the night, bask in the campfire. Your group will enjoy 80 acres of forest tucked in its own little valley in the Siuslaw watershed, Listen to the birds, watch the salmon spawn, walk through the woods, hug an old growth or sit in a hammock and do nothing. We provide a beautiful space for comfort, renewal & growth. We have a beautiful Lodge including bathrooms and showers, a 30 foot Yurt and a 20 foot Yurt. For cooking we have a fantastic out door kitchen including a wood fired pizza oven and also an indoor kitchen. Firewood and propane included along with all cooking equipment, dishes, utensils and table and chairs.

Remember, you are responsible for for all your bedding and providing your own meals.

We have limited cell reception and NO internet.

For reservations, CALL (we only make reservations via phone) to check that the date(s) you want are available. To hold your date, your deposit is required within seven days after making a reservation.

Overnight retreat: Check in 4pm; check out 3pm. If your retreat falls on the weekend (Friday, Saturday or Sunday), there is a two night minimum stay.

Our Capacity is 30 people whether your group is coming for the day or staying the night

Overnight Retreat Rate - \$25 per person per night with a minimum charge of \$250/night

(Children under 5 FREE; Children 6-11 \$10 per child per night)

*Please save for your records and share with members of your group*

**The following rules have been designed for the safety and enjoyment of all our campers while visiting Big Bear Camp. Violators of these rules will be gently asked to make amends or otherwise leave the campground without refund.**

Please read and obey all rules and posted signs. This property is privately owned. Big Bear Camp wants to keep prices reasonable which requires campers to help with their own clean-up and insurance. Thank you.

**Note:** The camper accepts camping privileges with the understanding that he does hereby release the campground and employees of all liability for loss or damage to property, and injury to his person arising out of his use of its camping facilities. Furthermore, he agrees to indemnify the campground and its officers and employees, against claims resulting from loss or damage to property, or injury to persons of any member of the family or guest of the registered camper arising out of the use of its camping facilities.

## General

- All visitors check in with host upon arriving.
- Check-in is 4 P.M., Check-out time is 3 P.M. on last day.

(For alternative times, please check with hosts prior to your stay.)

- Please stay on paths and trails. Bicycles use roads only.
- Big Bear Camp is off the grid. Bathrooms have motion sensitive lighting. Lodge has limited lighting.

## Campers

need flashlights and/or battery operated lanterns.

There are no electrical outlets.

- Cellphone accessibility is limited, Please contact camp host for emergencies.
- Fireworks, and Firearms, are not allowed.
- Smoking allowed in campfire circle, with other campers' approval. Please put butts into fire ring.

**Wildlife** Please protect wildlife. Please do not feed, catch, harm any wildlife or collect firewood. (Firewood provided)

## Cooking

- Camp stoves in campsites are allowed (not open fires).
- Cooking allowed in fire circle and kitchen areas.
- Cooking utensils and dishes for 30 campers are provided.
- Please wash dishes in clean-up sink and return to original place. All cleaning items are provided

## Fires

- **ABSOLUTELY NO OPEN FIRES OTHER THAN IN**

**GROUP FIRE RING. NOTE:** Fuel for fires is provided. Please consult host for any fire activity (fire ring or in wood stoves or pizza oven.)

- Fires must be attended by an adult.
- Fires in Fire Circle are to be extinguished or covered with

metal lid before retiring.

- Please no candles in any building or outside.

## Children

- Parents or guardians are responsible for the safety and actions of their children.
- Wading in creek is at your own risk. Children should be accompanied by adults near and in creek.

## Pets

- There is a no-pet policy. Contact Camp hosts for exceptions.

## Refuse and Clean-up

- Please separate recyclables from other garbage and put in designated area near dumpsters.
- Please get cleaning supplies and check-out list from camp hosts to help with clean-up prior to leaving.
- Leave your campsite and group spaces as clean as you found them. You will be charged a fee for cleanup from your deposit if you do not take care of it yourself.
